

2020 CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY ACADEMY DATES: APRIL 1, 2020 - MAY 20, 2020

The Citizens Police Academy ("CPA") is a 8-week program designed to provide a direct overview of both law enforcement and community-related functions of Delaware Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement (DATE). Graduates of this course will have a better understanding of the operation of the Agency, and a greater awareness and appreciation of the daily challenges faced by our officers.

The Citizens Police Academy will meet each week, for **8-weeks**, on **Wednesday evenings beginning April 1, 2020** from **6:00 PM – 9:00 PM**. Classes are held at DATE's office located at 34 Starlifter Avenue, Dover, DE 19901. There is no fee for the program; however, we request that applicants be committed to the full eight-weeks.

The Citizens Police Academy consists of classroom and hands-on instruction. Some of the topics covered during the CPA include the following and are subject to change at any time by our agency.

- Tobacco Enforcement & Diversion
- Cooperating Underage Witness Program
- Fake ID's
- Responsible Server Training
- SWAT Overview from experienced officers
- Division of Gaming Enforcement
- Ride-A-Long (Alcohol CUW Operation)
- Conducting Vehicle Stops
- Firearms Training Overview and Demo
- And.....More!

All instructors for the academy are highly-trained and experienced police officers or professionals in their respective fields. In addition to in-depth presentations and demonstrations over the 8-week period, class members will be given the opportunity to attend a firearms demonstration at the Delaware State Police Firing Range. Members will receive instruction on proper weapon handling, weapons safety, and be allowed to fire departmental issued weapons. The Citizens Police Academy will conclude with a graduation ceremony on May 20, 2020. All members will received a certificate!

The Citizens Police Academy is open to all Delaware residents that are 18 years old or older. A clear copy of a valid state-issued ID or driver's license must be included with the application. A criminal history check will be performed on all applicants and the Division. The class size is limited to 20 students. Due to the high demand for this course, applicants are encouraged to apply immediately and include a valid email address on your application.

Applications must be received by March 15, 2020.

Applicants will be notified via email the week of March 18th so it's important to provide a valid email address.
